**Does Embedded Liberalism Reduce Polarization?**

- This project explores whether policies of compensating the losers of globalization, such as trade adjustment assistance, subsidies on critical mineral manufacturing industries, reshoring of production facilities, has successfully led to reducing the surge of the ‘nativist’ backlash.

**Corporate Lobbying for Social Policy**

- A significant number of MNCs in the US lobby Congress in support of bills that affect social liberties. Existing theories provide no account for firms that lobby for bills with unclear and diffuse benefits and concentrated costs. I plan to explain this puzzle by exploring whether social policy change can act as an entry barrier against competing firms, while also considering how much firms’ internal ideology–firms’ stockholders, employees, CEOs, and origin of countries–matters.

**Knowing Where you Stand: How Income Information Boosts Public Support for Economic Inclusion**

- We introduce a survey experiment that lowers individuals’ identification with their reference group, which leads to the increase in support for policies of minority inclusion. (with Sangji Lee and Seungwon Cha)

**Hands-off or Hands-free? Philanthropic Organizations’ Media Patronage and Narratives on Globalization**

- Philanthropic organizations have recently increased their funding of the ailing newspaper industry. This paper seeks to identify changes in the coverage volume and content on globalization of news agencies with declining readership revenue and greater capital inflow from philanthropic organizations.

**Mitigating Carbon Tax Resistance by Redistributive Earmarking: Evidence from S.Korea**

- A conjoint experiment reveals that earmarking tax revenue on redistributive purposes such as a lump-sum rebate can dampen resistance. (with Sung Eun Kim and Seungyeob Kim)
